

ORDER NO. 7.

WHEREAS, the Sanitary Board of Sanitary District No. 1 of Marin County, California, did, by order entered in its minutes, call and order an election to be held in said sanitary district on day January 10th, 1927, for submitting to the electors of said district the question whether the bonds of said district to the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be issued and sold for the purpose of raising money for the construction of a trunk line sewer approximately six and one-half miles in length running from Fairfax to Corte Madera Creek, with branches and appurtenances, now therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that notice of said election, signed by the Sanitary Board of said district or by a majority of said board, shall be posted not less than twenty days before said election in the following three public places in said district, to wit:

in bulletin board at Ross Station, one on the

bulletin board at the town Hall at San Anselmo

and one on the bulletin board in Church State, Palo Alto at Fairfax

and also be published once a week for three successive weeks before said election in the San Anselmo Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in said sanitary district, which said notice in words and figures shall read as follows:

There shall be two election precincts within said district for the purpose of holding said election known as "Election Precinct A" and "Election Precinct B", respectively.

"Election Precinct A" shall consist of regular election precincts ~~which have been~~ *as heretofore* officially established by the board of supervisors of Marin County for the holding of state and county elections. The polling place in said "Election Precinct A" shall be at *the Fire House at Ross*

and the officers to conduct and have charge of said election therein are hereby appointed and designated as follows:

Inspector (one) *C. P. Murray*
Judges (two) *Andrew Hecker* and *John B. Coulter*

"Election Precinct B" shall consist of regular election precincts ~~which have been~~ *as heretofore* officially established by the board of supervisors of Marin County for the holding of state and county elections. The polling place in said "Election Precinct B" shall be at *the Lion Hall at San Anselmo*

and the officers to conduct and have charge of said election therein are hereby appointed and designated as follows:

Inspector (one) *Joseph Capelli*
Judges (two) *Ellis Gray* and *Margaret Manning*

In case any of said election officers are not present at the time for opening the polls, the electors present may appoint election officers to conduct said election.

The polls for said election shall be and remain open from six o'clock a. m. to seven o'clock p. m. on said day of election except as provided by section 1164 of the Political Code of the State of California.

The amount of the proposed bonds is *Two Hundred thousand and 200,000.00* Dollars of the denomination of \$1000 each; they shall bear interest at the rate of six (6) per centum per annum, and run for a period of *Twenty* years; that is, *for 20* bonds shall be paid each and every year for *for 20* years and until all of said bonds have been paid.

The ballot shall contain the words "Bonds - Yes"

If, at said election, two-thirds of the votes cast thereat be in favor of the issuance of bonds as proposed by the Sanitary Board, said board shall thenceforth have full power and authority to issue and dispose of said bonds. If the result of the election be against the issuance of said bonds, no other election upon the question shall be called or held for a period of one year.

Sample ballots containing the above matter required to
be printed thereon shall be supplied to the electors of said dist-
rict by the secretary of the sanitary board, but a failure on the
part of any elector to receive such sample ballot shall not be
deemed to invalidate the election or affect in any manner the legal-
ity of any bonds that may be authorized thereat.

Any qualified elector of Sanitary District No. 1 of
Marin County, California, may vote at said election for or against
the question submitted. To vote in favor of, and to authorize
the incurring of a bonded debt for the purpose set forth in the
question, he or she shall put a cross (X) upon the ballot with
pencil or ink after the words "Bonds - Yes" printed opposite said
question; and to vote against and refuse to authorize the incurr-
ing of a bonded debt for the purpose set forth in said question,
he or she shall put a cross (X) upon the ballot with pencil or
ink after the words "Bonds - No" printed opposite said question.
A cross (X) put in the voting square to the right of
the question shall be counted as a vote in favor of,

The election precincts for the holding of said election shall be those described in the Notice of Election hereinbefore contained and the officers of said election shall be those set forth in said notice. At said election the polls shall be opened at six o'clock a. m. and be kept open until seven o'clock a. m. of that day, when they shall be closed except as provided in Section 1164 of the Political Code of the State of California.

Every qualified elector resident within the district at the length of time necessary to enable him to vote at a general election shall be entitled to vote at the election herein provided for. After the votes shall have been announced, the ballots shall be sealed up and delivered to the secretary or president of the Sanitary Board, which board shall, on the seventh day after the election, at eight o'clock p. m., meet and canvass the returns of the election; and if it appears that two-thirds of the votes cast at said election were in favor of issuing said bonds, then the board shall cause an entry of that fact to be made upon its minutes, and said board shall thenceforth proceed to issue and dispose of said bonds as authorized by law.
