

ORDER NO. 5.

AN ORDER PROVIDING FOR THE ENCLOSURE OF MANURE PILES.

The Sanitary Board of Sanitary District No. 1 of Marin County, California, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, copartnership, or corporation, owning, leasing, or occupying, any lot of land, to suffer, allow, or permit, to remain thereon, any manure pile, or piles, unless the same be enclosed by a tight board fence of sufficient height to obstruct said manure pile, or piles, from view of any person, or persons, walking, driving, riding, or passing, over, or along, any street, avenue, highway, or public or private roadway, and, also, from the view of any person, or persons, riding on any passenger train in the vicinity thereof.

Section 2. Any person, or persons, firm, copartnership, or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed Twenty-five days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. All Ordinances, and parts of Ordinances, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately from and after its passage.
