Ross Valley Sanitary District Obtains Clearance from U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for Larkspur Landing Site

Clean-up activities have been completed at the former wastewater treatment plant, allowing the District to initiate public outreach regarding future uses at the 10.7-acre site.

LARKSPUR, CA, January 10, 2022 – Today, the Ross Valley Sanitary District (RVSD) announced that clean-up activities have been completed at the site of the former treatment plant with the final signoff from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The EPA’s official clearance letter allows unrestricted land use for the site and enables the District to initiate community outreach to help determine future uses of the property at 2000 Larkspur Landing Circle.

“The District has worked meticulously with the EPA to reach this important milestone for the Larkspur Landing property,” stated Steve Moore, RVSD General Manager. “Moving forward, we intend to analyze a variety of options for the site and we invite our ratepayers and local community members to participate in the process to evaluate the future of the property.”

With the EPA’s signoff, the District is launching a community survey to collect feedback from interested stakeholders regarding the potential use of the site. The survey is available online at www.surveymonkey.com/r/LarkspurLanding as well as printed versions at the RVSD headquarters.

Over the past year, the RVSD Board of Directors has conducted informational sessions in anticipation of the EPA’s signoff. The webpage also includes details on the process for managing the potential surplus property in accordance with the City of Larkspur General Plan and state law.

“The Larkspur Landing site is an incredibly rare piece of land in Marin County,” offered Doug Kelly, President of the RVSD Board. “With the EPA’s signoff, we can begin the process of determining the path forward to unlock the true potential of this site. The Board looks forward to partnering with our ratepayers, community stakeholders, and the City of Larkspur throughout this public process.”

The District will collect survey responses until March 10, 2022 and schedule future public hearings and meetings to review potential uses for the property.
